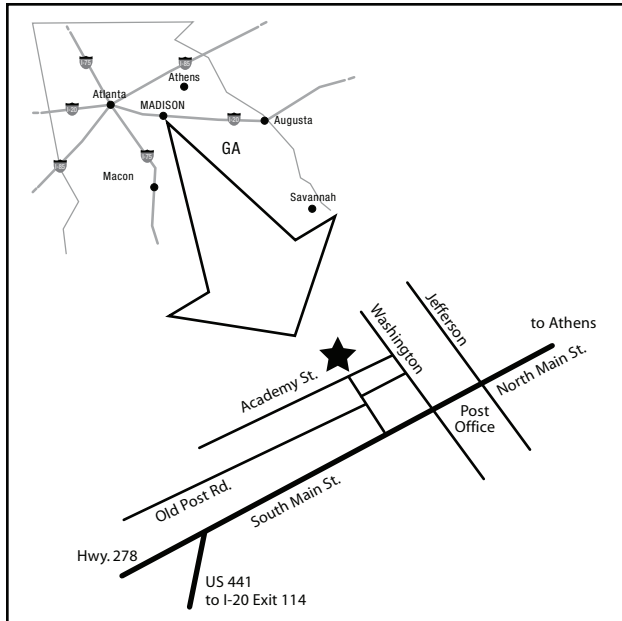

The Museum is housed in the historical home of John Wesley Moore, circa 1895. This home was donated to this museum initiative by Rev. Alfred Murray. The house was moved to historic downtown Madison at 156 Academy Street and fully restored.
