THE RAYMOND ANDREWS PRIZE



The Raymond Andrews Prize is a creative writing contest for high school students in Morgan County, Georgia. The purpose is to celebrate reading and writing by recognizing creativity among young people in our area.

Fiction and creative non-fiction entries are eligible for the competition. Over \$600 will be awarded to students with winning entries. Students who live in Morgan County or attend Morgan County High School are invited to enter. Winners will receive cash prizes and will be featured at the Raymond Andrews Prize Reading.

Novelist Raymond Andrews, the namesake for the prize, was born and raised in Morgan County. He published three novels and four other books. Almost all of them are set in the fictional Muskhogean County, which is a stand-in for Morgan County. Though the first priority of this initiative is to promote creative writing to high school students, a secondary goal is to educate young people about a nationally respected writer who was raised in our community.
